CUC Beautifies Seven Mile Public Beach

The Seven Mile Public Beach received a makeover last Saturday (8th February) thanks to the Community Involvement Team of Caribbean Utilities Company, Ltd. (CUC) who commenced a second beautification project there.

Joined by CUC volunteers and friends of the Company, the Team repainted four of the eight cabanas that they first painted in attractive colours almost five years before to enhance the atmosphere of the beach. Each of the newly painted cabanas were also outfitted with tables and garbage bins that have made the surroundings much more colourful for picnics and other events.

The Team's Beaches & Parks Beautification Programme is one of its key ongoing community projects. Since 1998, in addition to the Seven Mile Public Beach, the Team has organised beautification projects in East End, North Side and George Town.
